Sample Tool for U.S. Health Departments to Assess Exposure Risk in Travelers Arriving from a Country with an Ebola Disease or Marburg Virus Disease Outbreak

OVERVIEW

This document contains sample questions that can be used to assess the risk for ebolavirus or marburgvirus exposure in travelers identified as having spent time in the past 21 days in a country with an Ebola disease (Ebola) or Marburg virus disease (Marburg) outbreak.

How to use these questions

Screen traveler for potential exposure using the initial screening questions. Ask the additional public health risk assessment questions if a traveler answers YES to questions B, C, D, or E. Questions in the public health assessment may be tailored to the results of the initial screening.

INITIAL SCREENING QUESTIONS

In the last 21 days, while in outbreak country:

- A. Were you in the area where the outbreak is occurring [refer to the published map on the CDC website]?
- B. Did you have any contact with or were you around a person sick with Ebola or Marburg, or a person who was sick with or died of an unknown sickness compatible with Ebola or Marburg?
- C. Did you have any exposure to blood or other body fluids?
- D. Did you visit a health clinic or hospital?
- E. Did you touch a dead body or attend a funeral?
