How to Register:

- Partners interested in registering should proceed to the <u>Public Health</u> <u>Professionals Gateway</u> to fill out the account request form. You will be required to provide your contact information, your job title, and the name of your organization.
- Once you submit the request, you will receive an e-mail containing your user name and a temporary password that you will use to complete the registration process with the SAMS Partner Portal.
- **Step 1:** Enter your user name, temporary password, and accept the conditions of use
- Step 2: Create a new password to replace the temporary password
- **Step 3:** Send an e-mail to <u>IRU-Services@cdc.gov</u> indicating you have completed registration

podcasts

CDC produces audio and video podcasts on a wide range of topics and posts them on the Podcasts at CDC site. Some podcasts target health professionals but many target the general public. All CDC podcasts are public domain.

communications

CDC cleared communication products intended for re-distribution by local health departments. Many of the products include active form fields to add individual state or local department identification. Topics and products will be added on a continuous basis.

rights-free photography

Access to hundreds of professional, royalty-free photographs from the Public Health Image Library (PHIL) oriented to public health communicator needs. Topics include: disease and disease agents, every day activities, health behaviors, public health in action.

design templates

A coordinated suite of professionally designed templates. Templates are provided in both Adobe InDesign and Microsoft Office software. Templates for posters, factsheets, PowerPoint presentations and scientific posters are available.

matte articles

CDC offers matte articles on relevant public health topics available for health departments to share.

medical illustrations

Access to free illustrations of medical/scientific concepts and processes including: anatomy, fetal development, routes of disease exposure and progression.
